1906	Immigrated to the United States.
1907	L.A., studied art in night school.
1910	Moved to New York.
1916-1920	Studied with Kenneth Hayes Millar at the Art Students League.
1918-1922	Spent summers studying at Hamilton Easter Field's Ogunquit (Maine) School of Painting and Sculpture.
1919	Married Katherine Schmidt.
1920's	Commercial photographer of works of art.
1922	First one man exhibition of painting at the Daniel Gallery, New York.
1925	Spent 10 months in Europe traveling with his wife.
	Exhibition at the Daniel Gallery.
1928	Second trip to Europe.

1929	Built a home at artist's colony in Woodstock, New York.
1932	Divorced from Katherine.
1933	Begins teaching at the Art Students League, New York.
1935	Marries Sara Mazo.
1936	Served on the national executive committee of the American Artists Congress, later elected one of its five Vice-Presidents.
1937	Sets up a darkroom in his Woodstock studio.
1940	Speech at the Museum of Modern Art, New York, "What is American in American Art."
1941	Surrendered his camera to the United States government.
1942	Retrospective exhibition of his works for the benefit of the United China Relief at the Downtown Gallery, New York; designs war posters for the Office of War Information.
1946	Organized a Harvest Festival Dance at Woodstock to benefit Japanese in American relocation camps.
1947-1951	First President of Artists Equity.
1948	Recipient of the Whitney Museum's first one-man retrospective show of a living artist's work.
1953	Dies.

Scope and Content Note

Photographic materials of Yasuo Kuniyoshi (1889-1953), Japan-born painter and photographer who worked in New York from 1910 until his death. Includes 35mm black and white negatives, 1935-1941, and work prints of portraits and scenes at Woodstock, New York.

Series one contains 1554 nitrate negatives created from 1935 to 1941. Please note that all negatives in this collection were moved for isolation to the small room next to the Conservation lab (9/4/2015). These negatives are separated into five boxes labeled A-E. Box E specifically houses published portraits and nudes. Series two is made up of eight work prints in a single folder.
